Please note Durant School's policy on meal charges:

All students in grades pre-kindergarten through six may charge (6) meals at school. Student in grades 7-12 may charge (1) meal. Cafeteria charges will be limited to the maximum number of meals outlined above per child from August to May 1. **After May 1 there will be no charges allowed for students.** Students who reach this limit will not be allowed to charge in the cafeteria. Rather than allow a child to go hungry, the school will provide an alternative meal, defined as a reimbursable meal according to state and federal guidelines. In an effort to keep a child on a regular meal program, the school will contact parents by sending a notice home with their child when their account balance is \$10.00 or less. **After May 1 of each school year, there will be no charges permitted and outstanding accounts will require payment in full.**

PATIENTS' FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

“What is RAM Oklahoma?”

Remote Area Medical (RAM) Oklahoma is a free healthcare weekend for those in need of care they cannot afford. It's made possible by volunteer medical, dental and vision professionals, general volunteers and sponsors. We will treat as many patients on a first-come first-served basis as we can, based on the number of volunteers we have. Our goal is to serve 1,500 patients during the weekend.

“What services will be provided?”

Patients will have the ability to choose either dental, vision, physician or women's services care. Dental patients can receive cleanings, fillings or extractions. Vision patients will receive an eye examination and will have a pair of glasses made on site, if prescribed. A limited number of mammograms and pap tests will be offered to women. General physicians will be able to conduct physicals and run a limited number of lab tests, if necessary.

“Will root canals or dentures be available?”

No. Unfortunately, the procedures are too time-consuming for this event.

“Can I get glasses and dental work?”

In an effort to provide as many patients with care as possible, patients will have to choose a primary service to receive first. If possible, patients will be able to get back in line to receive a second type of service. (RAM triage assistants may require patients seeking dental or vision care to be examined by a physician first.)

“Who can receive care?”

RAM patients will be seen on a *first-come first-served basis* regardless of income or immigration status. However, patients will have the opportunity to be screened for Medicaid eligibility, which could help meet their future health care needs. Minors must be accompanied by a parent or legal guardian.

“Where is the event to be held?”

RAM Oklahoma will be held on the Southeastern Oklahoma State University campus at the gymnasium and arena located on First Street. Patients should enter at the corner of University and First. For directions and a map of the campus go to http://carmine.se.edu/map/campus_map.pdf see building 27 and 28, (28 is registration.)

“What time do I need to get in line?”

Volunteers will begin providing care at 6 a.m. each day, but you must have a patient number to receive care. We will begin passing out patient numbers after 3 a.m. in front of the Gymnasium on the corner of University and 1st street. (Once you receive a number, you cannot leave the area without forfeiting that number.)

“Will I be fed while waiting for care?”

No. Some snacks will be available to diabetics and children, but patients should come prepared to wait **several hours** for care at the event. Be sure to bring a day's worth of medications, snacks and baby supplies. Water and restrooms will be provided.

“What is the temperature going to be?”

Temperature can change at a moments notice! This event will take place in **June in Oklahoma**. All possible effort will be made to keep waiting patients cool, but RAM recommends patients bring, umbrellas, water bottles, squirt bottles, coolers, fans, etc. Please be extra cautious.
