<p>Arrival/Breakfast Doors open at 7:30 Breakfast: Times will vary to accommodate social distancing, but each class will have 25 minutes for breakfast.</p>	<p>Plan: <i>Counselor, Principal, and Secretary will control and monitor student arrival. Teacher Assistants will deliver breakfast to the classrooms, assist with breakfast in the cafeteria, and assist students getting safely to the classrooms.</i></p> <p>The health and safety of students and staff is our top priority. Limiting visitors in our building will be one more safeguard. Parents will remain in designated areas. We ask that you drop your child off in the mornings on the south side of the school. School personnel will be there to assist getting your children in the building.</p>
<p>Dismissal Early Buses at 2:10 Late Buses at 2:30 Car Riders at 2:30</p>	<p>Plan: <i>Bus Riders – Counselor and Principal will put students on the early buses while maintaining social distancing. Teacher Assistants will put students on the late buses while maintaining social distancing.</i></p> <p><i>Car Riders – The Counselor with assistance of staff will manage car riders on the north side of the school. The Principal with assistance of staff will manage car riders on the south side of the school. Parents will be given colored coded tags to place on their rearview mirrors to assist with afternoon pickup.</i></p>
<p>Classrooms</p>	<p>Plan: <i>*Student tables will be arranged in a manner that will support social distancing.</i> <i>*Tables will all be turned the same direction or in a manner that accommodates social distancing.</i> <i>*Teachers will teach and model to students about hygiene and social distancing once students arrive in the morning before eating breakfast.</i> <i>*Prioritizing standards is something we will continue to monitor and do.</i></p>

	<p><i>*We have been following a pacing guide for the last couple of years, and we will continue this procedure.</i></p> <p><i>*Student supplies will be placed in school boxes with student names on the them.</i></p> <p><i>*Manipulatives will be sanitized on a regular basis.</i></p> <p><i>*Lion Lane and Cub Court will be sanitized on a regular basis.</i></p> <p><i>*Cleaning supplies will be available for staff.</i></p> <p><i>* In order to provide a safe learning environment, all school water fountains will be used for a water bottle filling station. Students are encouraged to bring water bottles from home, but water bottles must be CLEAR.</i></p> <p><i>*Twins and siblings will be placed in the same classroom this year due to Covid-19 contact tracing.</i></p>
<p>Lunch Times will vary to accommodate social distancing, but each class will have 30 minutes for lunch.</p>	<p>Plan: <i>Lunches will be provided in the classroom and in the cafeteria to provide social distancing. Teacher Assistants will deliver lunches to the classrooms and assist teachers with lunches in the cafeteria and classrooms. Lunches in the cafeteria will be staggered in order to maintain social distancing. Students can eat lunches provided by the cafeteria or bring a lunch to school with them in the mornings. To help minimize the amount of people who will be in the front office area, we will not accept lunch deliveries during the school day. If an extenuating circumstance warrants the delivery of an item to a student, parents must call the front office to make a request. Requests will be considered on a case-by-case basis.</i></p>
<p>Recess</p>	<p>Plan: <i>Recess will be staggered with only one class at a time, on each of the playgrounds, Lion Lane and Cub Court.</i> <i>Teachers will be provided a schedule with their allotted times.</i></p>
<p>Electives/Specials</p>	<p>Plan: <i>Special Services will continue as normal while maintaining social distancing.</i></p>

<p>Masks</p>	<p>The Oklahoma State Department of Health has developed the Oklahoma COVID-19 Alert System; a four-tiered risk measurement tool with corresponding color categories that identify the current COVID-19 risk level. This tool offers the public and local elected officials an easy way to recognize each county’s risk level. Durant Public Schools will be following these levels and will REQUIRE MASKS, per the guidelines below, when Bryan County is in any level other than green. These levels are published every Friday for the following week at https://coronavirus.health.ok.gov/covid-19-alert-system.</p> <p>During levels of Yellow, Orange and Red the following guidelines apply to students, faculty, staff and visitors of Durant ISD.</p> <p>Grades PK-3</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Masks are required in all common areas inside the building (hallways, etc.) but not in classrooms. • Exception for masks: meals, naptime, recess & classroom. • Medical exemptions allowed with valid written medical documentation. <p>Transportation</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Masks are required by ALL ages while riding the bus. • Medical exemptions allowed with valid written medical documentation <p>Each student will be required to have a mask at school. It is the parent’s responsibility to provide masks.</p>
